

## Isaiah 8 New King James Version

### **Assyria Will Invade the Land**

**8** Moreover the LORD said to me, "Take a large scroll, and write on it with a man's pen concerning Maher-Shalal-Hash-Baz. 2 And I will take for Myself faithful witnesses to record, Uriah the priest and Zechariah the son of Jeberechiah."

<sup>3</sup> Then I went to the prophetess, and she conceived and bore a son. Then the LORD said to me, "Call his name Maher-Shalal-Hash-Baz; <sup>4</sup> for before the child <sup>[b]</sup>shall have knowledge to cry 'My father' and 'My mother,' the riches of Damascus and the <sup>[c]</sup>spoil of Samaria will be taken away before the king of Assyria."

<sup>5</sup> The LORD also spoke to me again, saying:

- "Inasmuch as these people refused
   The waters of Shiloah that flow softly,
   And rejoice in Rezin and in Remaliah's son;
- Now therefore, behold, the Lord brings up over them The waters of dthe River, strong and mighty—
  The king of Assyria and all his glory;
  He will go up over all his channels
  And go over all his banks.
- He will pass through Judah,
  He will overflow and pass over,
  He will reach up to the neck;
  And the stretching out of his wings
  Will fill the breadth of Your land, O Immanuel. [g]
- "Be shattered, O you peoples, and be broken in pieces!
   Give ear, all you from far countries.
   Gird yourselves, but be broken in pieces;
   Gird yourselves, but be broken in pieces.
- Take counsel together, but it will come to nothing;

Speak the word, but it will not stand, For [h] God *is* with us."

#### Fear God, Heed His Word

11 For the LORD spoke thus to me with [1] a strong hand, and instructed me that I should not walk in the way of this people, saying:

- "Do not say, 'A conspiracy,'
  Concerning all that this people call a conspiracy,
  Nor be afraid of their threats, nor be ktroubled.
- The LORD of hosts, Him you shall hallow;

  Let Him be your fear,

  And let Him be your dread.
- He will be as a "sanctuary,
  But a stone of stumbling and a rock of "offense
  To both the houses of Israel,
  As a trap and a snare to the inhabitants of Jerusalem.
- And many among them shall stumble;
  They shall fall and be broken,
  Be snared and [n] taken."
- Bind up the testimony,
  Seal the law among my disciples.
- And I will wait on the LORD,
  Who hides His face from the house of Jacob;
  And I will hope in Him.
- Here am I and the children whom the LORD has given me!

  We are for signs and wonders in Israel

  From the LORD of hosts,

  Who dwells in Mount Zion.

<sup>19</sup> And when they say to you, "Seek those who are mediums and wizards, who whisper and mutter," should not a people seek their God? *Should they seek* the dead on behalf of the living? <sup>20</sup> To the law and to the testimony! If they do not speak according to this word, *it is* because *there* [o] *is* no light in them.

21 They will pass through it hard-pressed and hungry; and it shall happen, when they are hungry, that they will be enraged and curse [2] their king and their God, and look upward. 22 Then they will look to the earth, and see trouble and darkness, gloom of anguish; and *they will be* driven into darkness.
